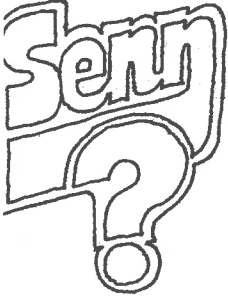


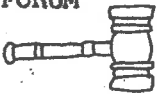

EDGEWATER LIBRARY



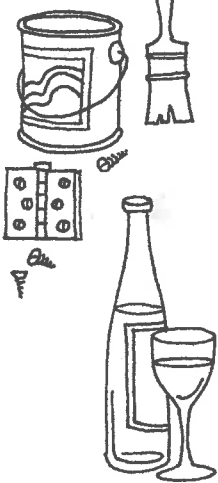
Now that our Edgewater Branch Library has been open more than a year we'll look into the many fine programs offered. For adults they have movies every Wed. at 3 P.M. and Thurs. at 7:30 P. M. Coming up will be a lecture on the Titanic April 17th and lecture on the liners of the 20th Century on June 12. There is a Senior Citizen group which meets on Friday at 1 P.M., a play-reading group on Tues. at 7:30 P.M. and Americanization classes Mon. and Fri. at 7:15 P.M.

For children there are story hours (age 3 - 5) and movies every Thurs. at 3:45, for children 5 - 12. They have special programs offered such as Story Dramatizations of Ferdinand the Bull coming Sat. May 3 and have also had fine puppet shows. There will be a slide show Tues. April 15 at 10:30 A.M. for parents regarding children's books. A special exhibit of the art class (10-13 Yrs.) will be shown Sat., April 5.

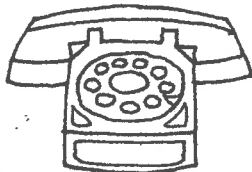
CONSERVATION

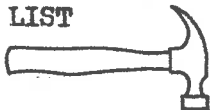

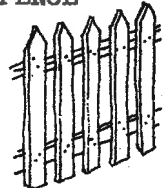
