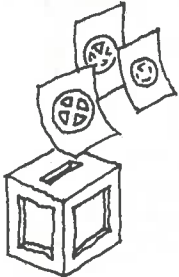

## SENN HIGH MEETING



Well-- you missed it! Things are really happening at Senn and it was a shame the rest of you weren't with us at our General meeting on March 26th. Mr. John Martin, Principal of Senn High School, gave us a very surprising and gratifying look at the renovating of its' hallowed halls. A complete electrical overhaul has just been accomplished, with new fixtures, dropped ceilings in the halls and classrooms and a public address system (at last!) -- classrooms are being redecorated with color coordinates selected by Students, teachers and parents (about 20% completed to date) -- plumbing and fixtures have been worked over -- one gymnasium is to be rebuilt and the other overhauled -- the huge assembly hall has been fully refurbished and looks great -- new equipment is going into the auto shop and metal shop -- the print shop is now producing the Senn Newsletter entirely with their new gear -- curriculum is being expanded with computer classed, a new multi-lingual program with excellent results and many new ideas coming up! -- there's an attractive conservatory in operation (not many of those around) -- another big item on the list: At the end of May the east campus (facing Glenwood) is to be completely worked over from scratch -- new sod with a sprinkler system -- new walks, shrubs, and trees -- all laid out in an attractive design that should please everyone -- and no more fences!

1.8 million dollars has been spent already and when it is all finished, over 4 million will have gone into the program. All this has helped to develop a new sense of pride and responsibility at Senn that hasn't been around for a long time, among teachers and students alike. The problems and difficulties that existed on campus a few years ago are virtually nil nowadays, with students and teachers working together under the able guidance of John Martin. A great deal has been accomplished in a very short time and Senn High School is now, as it once was -- something special in our community!



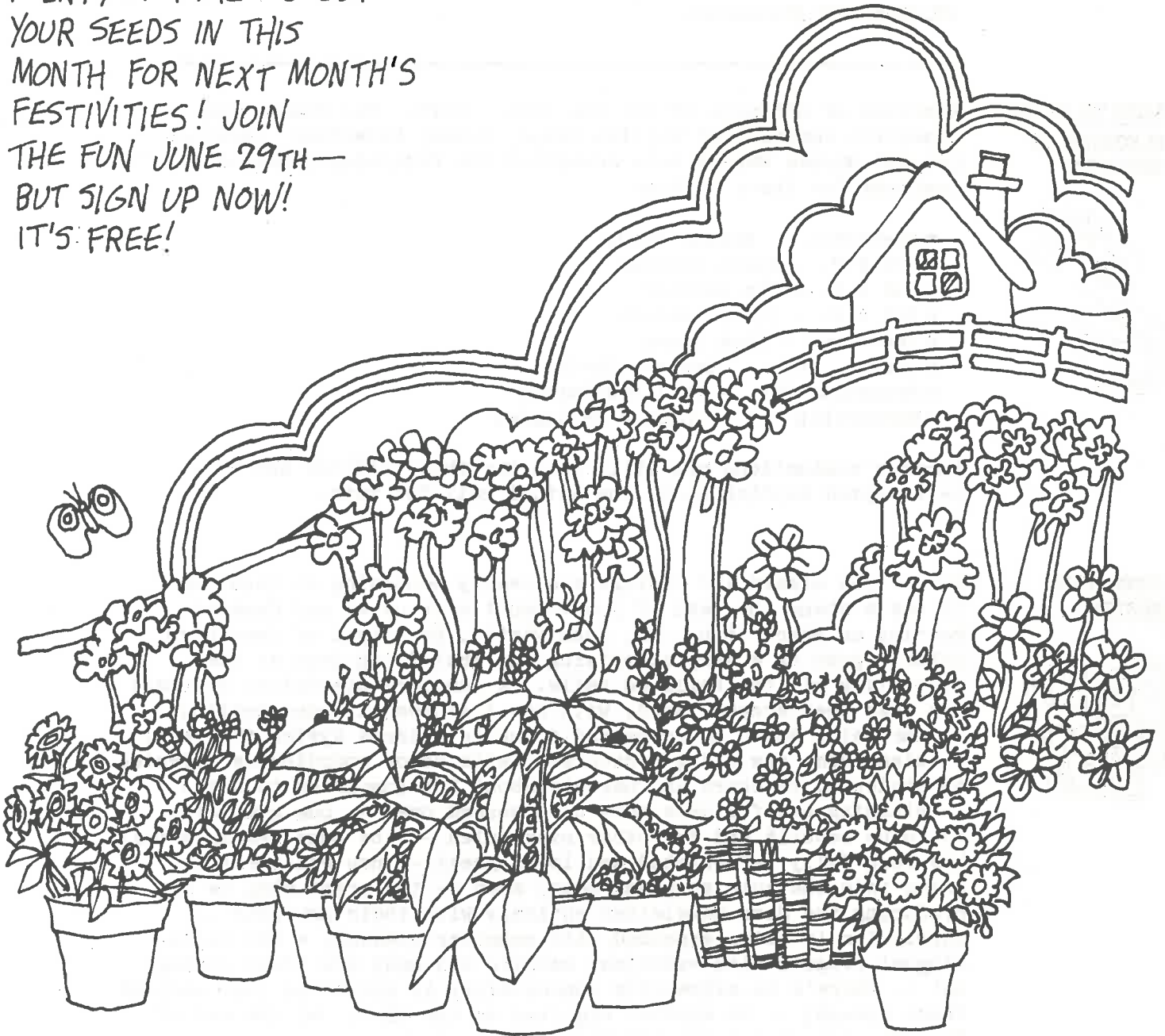
