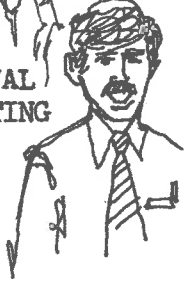

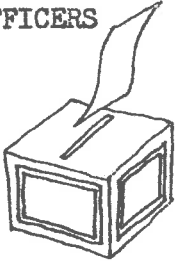


ANNUAL MEETING

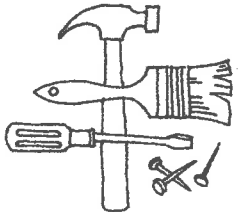


REAL ESTATE



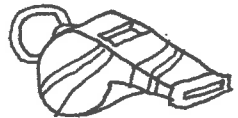

HANDYMAN LIST



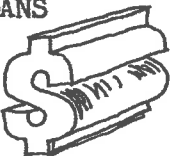

OPERATION WHISTLESTOP



Do you want to feel safer when you're out on the street? Don't forget to buy and carry your own whistle and use it in an emergency. Not only will you scare off a would-be assailant but residents who hear the sound will immediately call the police. That's Operation Whistlestop--the program that the Edgewater Community Council set up in 1973 to help prevent crime. The ECC reports that 50,000 whistles were distributed last year which makes 230,000 since the program began. You can buy your whistle for \$1.00 at the Granville Stationers, 1106 West Granville (274-9747), or at the ECC Office, 1112 West Bryn Mawr (334-5609). You will also receive an Operation Whistlestop sticker for your door to let others know you will be responding to their need for help.

HOME IMPROVEMENT LOANS



The Edgewater Glen area is located in one of twenty specially designated neighborhoods of Chicago where persons may apply to the Chicago Home Improvement Loan Program for below-market-rate interest loans to rehabilitate single-family homes or 2-to-6 flat dwellings. Loans of up-to-\$25,000 will be issued at an interest rate of 7% for a maximum of fifteen years. Persons interested may obtain information by calling 263-0572.
