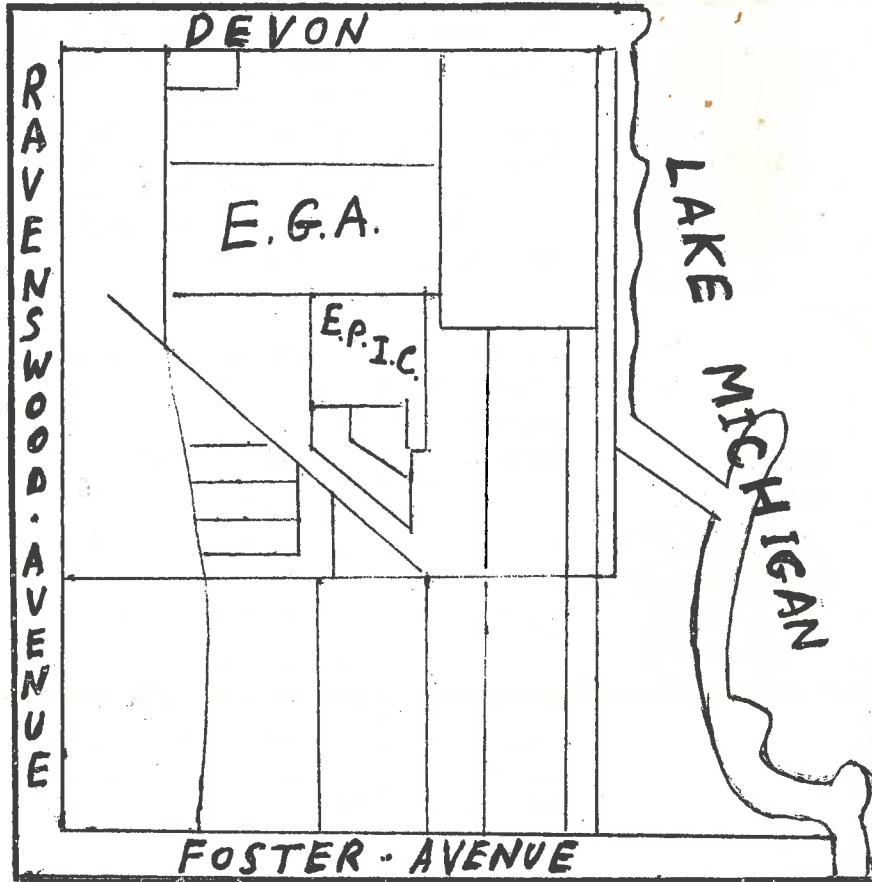

Recently, some members of the Edgewater Glen Association have asked that EGA become an organizational member of O.N.E. (the Organization of the North East). The request has raised some heated discussion about the issue. Those opposing the idea feel that EGA would lose its identity and autonomy and would be forced to support all positions taken by ONE. Those supporting the idea feel that ONE has the same goals as EGA--the betterment of the community; to support their case, they have asked that the following editorial be re-printed in our newsletter.

"Success is essential to any community group, but a little well-deserved recognition along the way never hurt.

"That's why we applaud the Neighborhood Awards going to two of the North Side's largest groups, Organization of the Northeast and the North River Commission. The honors, bestowed by Trust, Inc. --a citywide civic association devoted to exploring the challenges that confront Chicago--were presented Dec. 1, by Gov. Thompson.

"ONE and NRC are as different in their approach and structure as the communities they serve--Uptown and Edgewater for one, Albany Park, North Park, Hollywood Park, and Mayfair for the other. But both share the common goal of making their particular areas, and in turn the city, a more attractive place to live and work..." (Lerner Newspaper editorial).

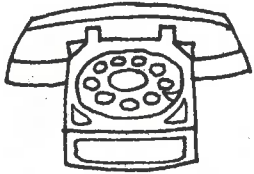


EGA REAL ESTATE COMMITTEE

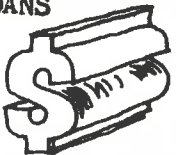

HOME IMPROVEMENT LOANS



The Edgewater Glen area is located in one of twenty specially designated neighborhoods of Chicago where persons may apply to the Chicago Home Improvement Loan Program for below-market-rate interest loans to rehabilitate single-family homes or 2-to-6 flat dwellings. Loans of up-to-\$25,000 will be issued at an interest rate of 5% below the current rate for a maximum of fifteen years. Persons interested may call 263-0572 for further information.
