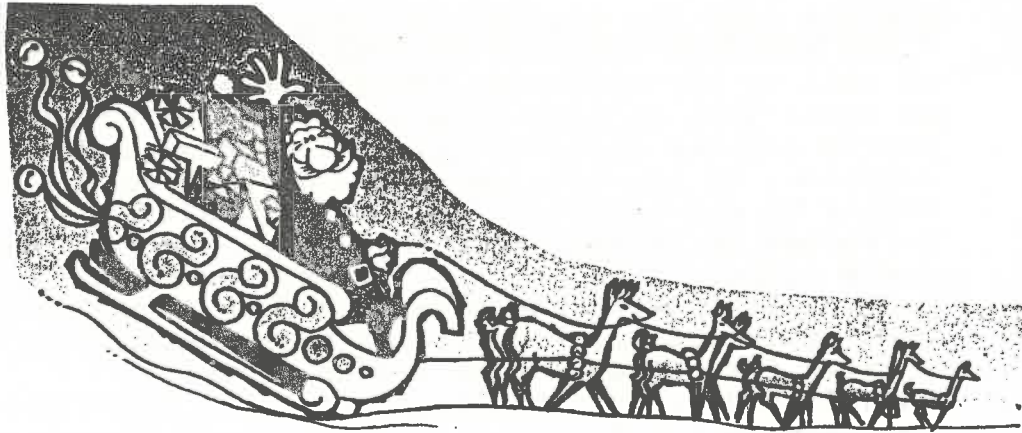

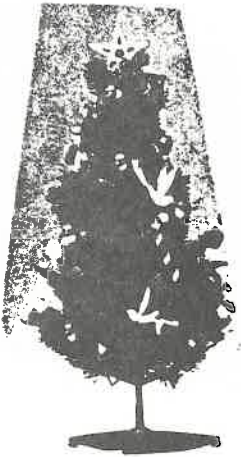


Announcing the First Annual Christmas Decoration Contest for Edgewater Glen:

NEIGHBORS HELP NEIGHBORS IN ONGOING EDGEWATER PROGRAM

Eighty-seven year old Mary Kane is a widow. Although she is hard of hearing and is beginning to have some trouble walking, she lives alone in an apartment in Edgewater and with a little help from her friends is keeping out of a nursing home.

Mary's "friends" are nuns (Sisters of Charity of the Blessed Virgin Mary) in the Neighbors Program who live at Wright Hall, 6364 Sheridan. They range in age from 75 - 88, which makes them contemporaries of the people they serve. Lay volunteers join the sisters in their outreach.

"The program works two ways," explains 83 year old Sister Rosaria, who makes weekly phone calls to her lonely neighbors. "I help my clients by chatting with them each day, helping them make decisions on what to have for supper that night, laughing about an over-cooked soft boiled egg or putting them in touch with someone who can assist them when they have financial or health problems.

"They help us by sharing their joys and sorrows, making us aware of how they cope with problems, keeping us busy with our neighborly services," Sister adds.

The goal of the Neighbor's Program, which was initiated in 1976, is to enable elderly people to maintain an independent status as long as possible by helping them help themselves, explains Sister Patricia DaCosta, BVM, program director.

"Most of our workers are retired sisters who help with small services such as shopping, being a companion on a visit to a doctor, writing letters, helping fillout applications or balance checkbooks, contacting relatives when a client is ill, daily phone calls, a listening ear, a friendly voice," DaCosta says. "Sisters and lay volunteers who have been named as eucharistic ministers bring communion to their Catholic neighbors in nursing homes and nearby apartments.

The director and her associate, Sister Maxine Rummelhart, BVM, provide such additional services as identifying agencies which will assist the elderly, helping with emergency medical or home needs, driving a client to the store or to the doctor.

The program is based on the concept of neighbors helping neighbors and for the most part the elderly helping the elderly. Volunteers prepare for their services through periodic how-to-do-it workshops at which they share problems, suggest solutions, and bone-up on more available assistance sources. "Neighbors" are available to all elderly people regardless of religion. For information, call the Neighbors' Program, 338-9196.
