Paul & Reet Wangerin, Membership Secretary, 1500 W. Glenlake, 274-8087

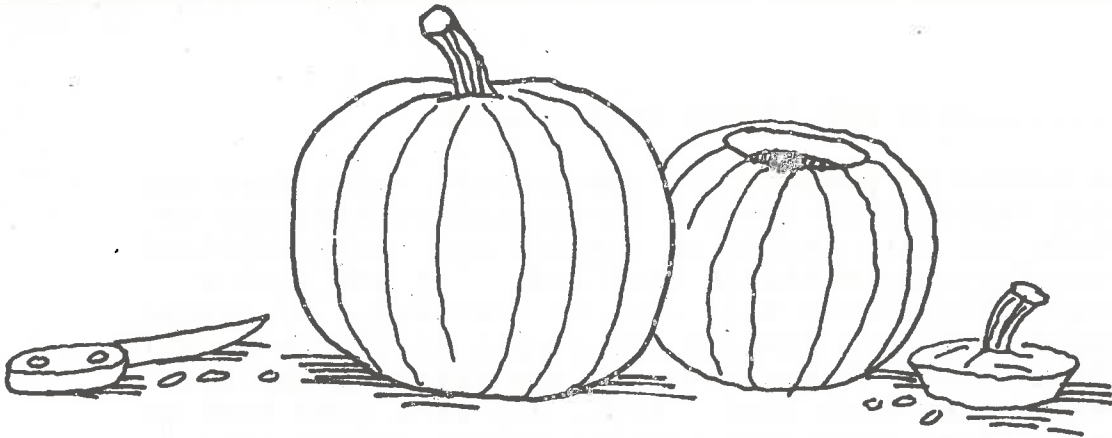

Dorothy Guthrie, 1st Vice President, 1431 W. Norwood, 743-1399

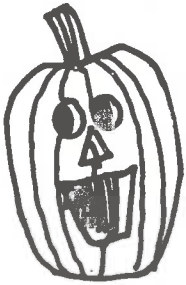

6. Call Lakewood-Balmoral for suggestions

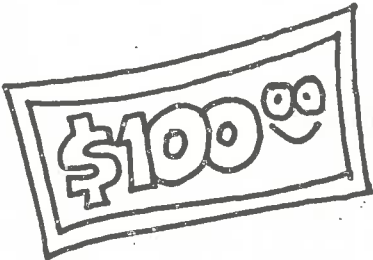


.....BITS AND PIECES IN THE GLEN

A very nice letter was received from the ECC's Save The Mansion Committee for a \$100 donation by the EGA to the committee. The letter reads in part:

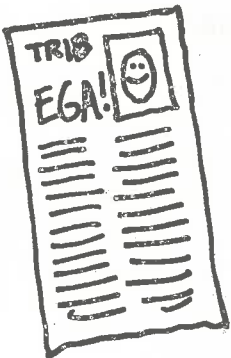
