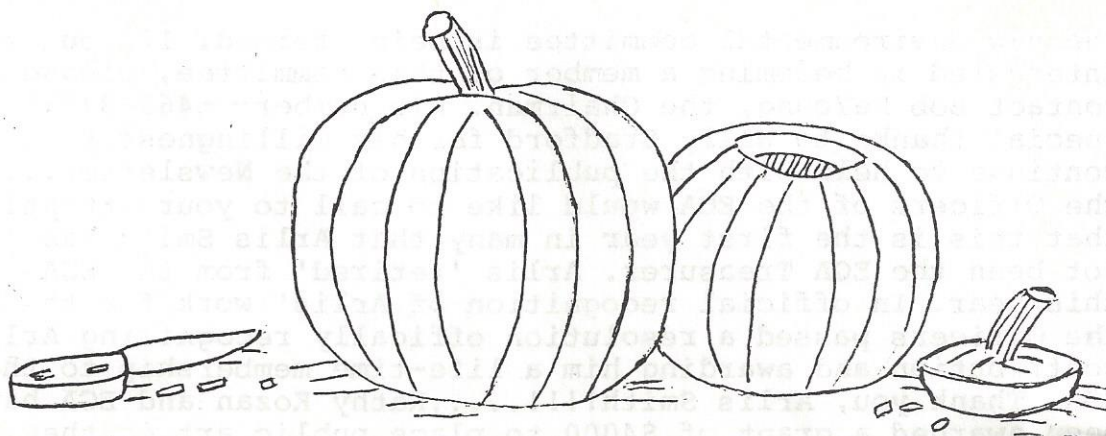

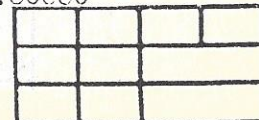

## A matter of neighborhoods

CHICAGO—The Aug. 25 article entitled "Study sees a 3d way for Uptown," by urban affairs writer Stanley Ziemba, is titled correctly but contains some inaccuracies in the text.

The article refers to the community of Uptown/Edgewater, which no longer exists. The two, unique neighborhoods with different economic and social characteristics were officially recognized as separate entities by the U.S. Bureau of the Census in 1980. Thus the study Ziemba cites, conducted by the Organization of the Northeast and the Center for Urban Affairs at Northwestern University last year, is based on outdated, nonapplicable data from 1970 to 1979.

Edgewater is a thriving neighborhood with strong cultural institutions, block clubs and businesses. We are smoothly integrating and successfully rehabilitating affordable housing due in part to such programs as the Edgewater Community Council's Housing Rehabilitation Program, and the input of the 48th and 49th Ward aldermen, Marion Volini and David Orr. We are at the same time "gentrifying," which is very obvious if one just takes a ride through our neighborhood.

We are in the process of creating exciting recreational space such as the Chicago Park District-Illinois National Guard Armory on Broadway, and the Berger Park-North Lakeside Cultural Center on Sheridan Road. We have attracted many new business franchises such as Wags, Kentucky Fried

Chicken, Popeye's, Taco Bell, Payless Shoes and the Super Gap in the last five years.

Those of us who live here know that Edgewater is a vital, growing, improving, changing and yet stable neighborhood that is very conducive to family life. Our public schools have some of the highest reading scores in the city and there is a rich variety of private schools.

We welcome our commonalities with the diverse community of Uptown and we applaud ONE's efforts, especially in the areas of housing rehabilitation and energy conservation, yet we must re-emphasize that your article refers to Uptown and not to Edgewater.
