Volunteers Sought to Fill Recently Defined Community Policing Job Descriptions - Letter from Mary Jane Haggerty - ECC

Dear EGA Members:

As many of you know, community policing has become a reality for the EGA end of Edgewater, which falls within the 24th District. The Chicago Alternative Policing Strategy (or C.A.P.S.) is based on the philosophy that the community and police working together can effectively solve problems and reduce the fear (whether actual or perceived) of crime.

Many of your neighbors have been involved in creating a structure for your beat and identifying problems over the past 11 months. However, in order for community policing to be truly effective, they need the cooperation and support of everyone in the community. Over the last three months, the beat organizing team has identified several ways to improve safety and deal with some of the problems.

Your section of beat 2433, which covers the same geographical area as the Edgewater Glen Association, will be developing a Court Watch Team, a neighborhood patrol, and a team of block watch coordinators to keep people up to date on CAPS. This letter is to invite you to participate in one or more of these activities. If you can donate one to three hours a month working on a specific activity (not going to meetings), and would like more details, please call me at the Edgewater Community Council, 334-5609.

Here is her summary: Block Rep -- Funnel concerns and problems to the police and city services. Community Alert Phone Tree Caller -- Call neighbors about meetings and alerts. Court Watch -- Provide community "presence" and support in court. Positive Neighborhood Patrol -- Walk through area to identify problems and concerns.

Graffiti Control -- Coordinate and/or assist with painting-removal of graffiti.
