EGA has again approved matching funding for the PARKWAY CORNER BEAUTIFICATION PROGRAM

For corners in need of some attention, EGA will reimburse 50% of material costs up to a maximum \$100 per parkway corner for preapproved projects. Eligible materials include perennials, shrubs, soil amendments, and mulch. Annuals are not eligible for matching funds. Liquor Sales Finally Halted in Two Stores at Winthrop and Granville

A battle of many years concluded on Friday, May 4 when 24th District police officers removed the city liquor licenses from Granville Liquors at 1100 Granville and Sun Food and Liquors at 1101 Granville. The election precinct in which the two stores are located was voted dry in a special referendum more than three years ago, but the two stores have staged a fierce battle in an effort to keep peddling booze. The stores first tried to stop the measure from going on the ballot and then fought all the way to the Illinois Supreme court. The victory would not have been possible without the pro bono services of Mayer Brown Rowe and Maw through one of their associates and neighborhood resident Patricia Sharkey. Sharkey is president of the Edgewater North Neighbors Block Club and the Granville Task Force. The Edgewater Community Council, including residents of Edgewater Glen, tried for many years to get the cooperation of the storeowners, particularly in discouraging panhandling and loitering in front of the stores. The stores will be allowed to remain open, but will not be allowed to sell any alcoholic products.

Mike Volini Announces His Retirement as 48th Ward Democratic Committeeman

Edgewater Glen resident Mike Volini surprised his many supporters and neighbors recently when he announced that he was stepping down from the influential post he has held for nearly 20 years. Mike is widely respected for the integrity and fairness that he has demonstrated over the years as leader of the Democratic Party in the 48th ward.
