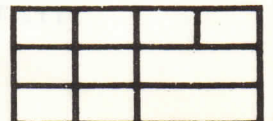
Although we are not members of any local organization at this point, your letter so impressed us that I wish to write and tell you how pleased we are that people in organizations such as yours, care as much as you do.

The VALU-GARD Concept...

From its origination, the system of identifying valuable property and making the fact known to a would-be burglar has been highly successful in crime reduction programs throughout the United States.

The impact of the system is two-fold. The first part of the Valu-Gard Concept of protecting your valuables against the threat of burglary consists of etching each item with an identifying number, usually your driver's license number and state abbreviation. This number is then recorded on your Property Record along with other descriptive information for future reference to aid police officials in recovering and returning your property in the event it is stolen or lost. This will also give you a valuable record for insurance purposes in case of fire loss.
