As part of the Clark Street resurfacing, the intersection at Clark and Granville has been widened to accommodate left turn lanes on Granville.

In response to community concerns about the narrowing of the sidewalks, the Alderman consulted with officials of CDOT and IDOT, who proceeded with the reconstruction of the intersection. Both agencies agree, that improved traffic flow through the intersection should improve safety and the sidewalks exceed safety parameters.
