All Edgewater Glen members and their neighbors and friends are welcome to attend. Refreshments will be served.

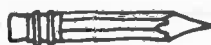
BERGER

A recent issue of the Rogers Park-Edgewater News reported that "the runner-up in the annual Citizen of the Year Contest to spotlight area residents who have made significant volunteer contributions to the community is DANIEL "LOUIE" BERTUCA of Edgewater, who has shared his belief that decency, honor, hard work, and caring are important values with hundreds of young people."

"Bertuca," the paper reported, "who loves kids and the Edgewater neighborhood he has lived in all his life, believes that a neighborhood should be a support system for residents and was alarmed to see young thugs roaming the streets and gang activity involving drugs and alcohol."

"So he started walking the streets, talking with kids and becoming their friend. In the course of these encounters he intervened when he saw a woman being harrassed and was subsequently attacked by her assailants. Once he apprehended a driver whose truck went out of control and almost struck a group of kids."

"Believing that sports are positive activities for young people, Bertuca has organized softball teams and a weightlifting club and, with the help of several North Side business men, has set up a meeting place for "Louie's kids."

"Despite having a full time job and working towards a master's degree, Bertuca also finds time to tutor kids two or three nights a week."
